R *s* zer Fireworks

Please use your fireworks in a responsible manner. Follow these safety tips to ensure everyone has a fun and safe show.

- \blacktriangleright Be courteous. Call neighbors, especially those with pets or livestock before using any fireworks items.
- > Alcohol and fireworks **DO NOT** mix. Never drink and use fireworks.



- Carefully read and follow the instructions on each fireworks item.
- Always wear safety glasses when lighting fireworks.




- > Do not allow children under the **age of 18yr.** to set off fireworks.
- > Never attempt to set off fireworks that have misfired. Wait 30 minutes then place them in a bucket of water.
- > Always Brace Cakes and Mortar Tubes! They can be prone to tip, place a block or something on at least 2 sides.
- > Never throw away discharged fireworks until the next day, they can smolder for several hours and start unsuspecting trash fires, or worse.



2022 Pennsylvania Law Updates

- > No one under the **age of 18yr.** of age may purchase, possess, or use consumer fireworks.
- > No fireworks may be used within **150 feet** of any building structure and can only be used on private property, with the property owners' permission.
- > No fireworks items may be used on public land according to state law; including county, state, or federally owned lands.
- > A person may not use fireworks within, directed at, or directed from a vehicle or building.
- ➢ No fireworks items may be directed at another person.
- > No person may use fireworks within **150 feet** of an animal housing facility or fenced area designed to confine livestock owned or managed by another person.



- > A person using fireworks at a distance of 150 to 300 feet from an animal housing facility or fenced area must give at least 72 hours' notice, in writing, to the owner or manager.
- \blacktriangleright Check with local authorities for local restrictions.
